9. What does the poet mean by 'rainbow tinted circles of light' ? Explain.
10. Who are the possible buyers of bangle ?

Tyger, tyger burning bright

What immortal hand or eye

Could frame they fearful symmetry ?

11. Identify the poem and the poet.
12. Whose hands framed the fearful symmetry of the tiger ?

Tell a' the seas gang dry, my dear

And the rocks melt wi' the Sun

14. What promise does the speaker give his lady love ?

Questions 15 - 29 : Answer any 8 questions in not more than 4 sentences. Each carries 3 scores.

(8 × 3 = 24)

15. How are the bangles described in the poem, 'The Bangle Sellers' ?
16. To what all does Robert Burns compare his love to in his poem 'A Red Red Rose' ?
17. What are the objections that the Duke raises against his last Duchess ?
18. How does the poet Langston Hughes express the inevitability of Social change in 'Oppression' ?

19. Why is Zapoikin invited by poplausky for the funeral procession in the story, 'The Orator' ?
20. What was the routine of the narrator in the story 'A Man' ?
21. The lady in 'Romance of a busy broker' is described as unstenographic. Why ?
22. Why did the liftman throw the passenger out of his lift ?
23. How does literature protect human beings from prejudice and sectarianism ?
24. How do the children express their innocent love to the teacher ?
25. Why does the author say that the law is not reasonable in the essay 'On Saying Please' ?
26. What does Mrs. Higgins argue when she is asked to serve breakfast at 10 O'clock ?
27. What is the importance of the dream scene in the play 'The boy Comes Home' ?
28. What technique did Philip employ to make Rosenary suddenly lose interest in Miss. Smith in the story 'A Cup of Tea' ?

Questions 30 - 38 : Answer any 4 questions in about 80 words. Each carries 5 scores.

(4 × 5 = 20)

30. Attempt a paragraph on the theme of the poem 'Since Brass, nor stone, nor earth, nor boundless sea'.

(All strong objects are affected by time, aging – the power of writing)

31. What all things were strange in Zapoikin's funeral speech about Babilonov ?

(Profoky Osipitch was not the dead one – not a bachelor – bearded)

32. Give an account of the embarrassing experience the narrator had to face in the restaurant. How did he come out of it ?

(goes to the restaurant with 14 rupees – takes a meal - the wallet was missing – humiliation and reproaches – Pickpocket's Mercy)

33. "Miss. Lesile, I have but a moment to share will you be my wife ?" asks Mr. Maxwell. Analyse the character of the Maxwell.

(New York broker – moved by wheels and springs – workoholic – plunges into heaps of work – forgetful – forgets his wife)

34. The beggar regretted his action at the end of the day in the poem 'I had gone a begging'. Explain.

Beggar going for begging – sees a chariot – king – begs for alms – gave only 'least little grain of corn' – evening found a little grain of gold in his bag – realized his folly – attitude defines future)

35. Why was it always fine weather in the conductor's bus described in 'On Saying Please'.

(Sweet, sincere and polite to passenger – helped author when he didn't have money to buy ticket – considerate to both elders and children – very pleasant – showed inexhaustible fund of patience)

36. How does Ilosa prove that literature has become a female activity? What is your view on this?

(Fewer work hours than men – more time – devote to fantasy and illusion – survey in Spain – women readers surpassed men by 6.2% - your views)

37. How does John become the hero in 'Lincoln came to Pittsburgh'?

(Goes to see Lincoln – others belittle him – they couldn't meet – John squeezes through – hero)

38. How is the theme of destruction of family relationships and marriage described in the story, 'A Canary for One'?

(Theme of disintegration of marriage – American ideal juxtaposed with harsh reality)

Questions 39 - 44 : Answer any 3 questions in about 150 words. Each carries 8 scores. (3 × 8 = 24)

39. Analyse 'The Cuckoo' by William Wordsworth as a typical romantic poem.

(Choice of subject matter – subjective and personal deep feeling – importance to nature – importance to emotions or enjoyment than to facts and figures)

40. The memoir 'Last Day at School' describes a lively classroom in all its warmth and innocence. Elucidate.

(Exam result – Martenelli Surpassed – Cripa Autonelli, Mainale, Spadoni – Teacher handing back confiscated things – children near the desk with brimming eyes – innocent confession – present tokens of love - tearful adieu)

41. "The Boy Comes Home is a comedy that discusses many serious issues in a light manner." Elucidate.

(Conflict between generation – Philip representing new order, modern values, will to act in a proper and reasonable manner – Uncle James represents the old order, conservative view point, unreasonable attitude with seeming strict outlook – hollow discipline – weak personality of overstrict – the effect of war on the personality of the youth)

42. What are the characteristics that make 'My Last Duchess' a successful dramatic monologue ?

(Dramatic monologue, a poem written in the form of a speech of an individual character, it compresses into a single viewed scene a narrative sense of the speakers history – psychological insight into the character – 'My Last Duchess' as a dramatic monologue)

43. Attempt a critical appreciation of the poem, 'Elegy for Jane', taking into account its themes, structure, literary devices and mood.

(Elegy – uses intense national images to depict a deceased young woman and the love the speaker has for her theme – nature, love, death – structure of the poem – free verse in four stanzas – literary devices – personification, metaphor and simile)

44. How does Alice walker convince the reader that animals also suffer, feel and grieve as humans do ? How does 'Am I Blue' focus on the evident connection between animals and humans ?

(Blue – dreary and weary life – Brown, a mare brought there – happy – pregnant – Brown taken away – depressed – just like humans, they also have feelings and senses)
